Two capsized kayakers rescued off Malibu coast

Two kayakers whose boat capsized were rescued Sunday afternoon in Malibu about one mile off of Corral Beach, according to the Los Angeles County Fire Department.

Sometime around 4 p.m., Baywatch crews rescued the kayakers, who were floating without lifejackets offshore. Lifeguard personnel also reached the kayakers around the same time as the Baywatch boat. Officials said the kayakers were blown out to the water by gusty winds and spent more than 30 minutes out of their kayak. At the time of the rescue, winds were blowing at around 20 mph.

The two kayakers were transported on the boat to the Malibu Pier for medical evaluation. Both were sent to a local hospital.

According to the LA County Lifeguard Twitter account, a beach bystander spotted the possible victims and alerted lifeguards.

"If not for [the bystander], the two victims may not have survived!" authorities wrote.

DiCaprio finds buyer for \$17.4M Malibu home

The features of the property, including high ceilings, plentiful windows, and a flat grassy lawn, make it seem like a desirable investment.

Two sites are accessible 24 hours a day for tree recycling: Bluffs Park (eastside cul-de-sac) and 29136 Pacific Coast Highway near Heathercliff Park.

Although the drop-off sites will be available through Jan. 12, residents are still welcome to cut up their trees and fit them into residential green waste bins. The same standards for tree preparation are required if you choose to cut up your own tree; namely, please remember to remove all nonorganic objects from the tree.


