Receiving honors

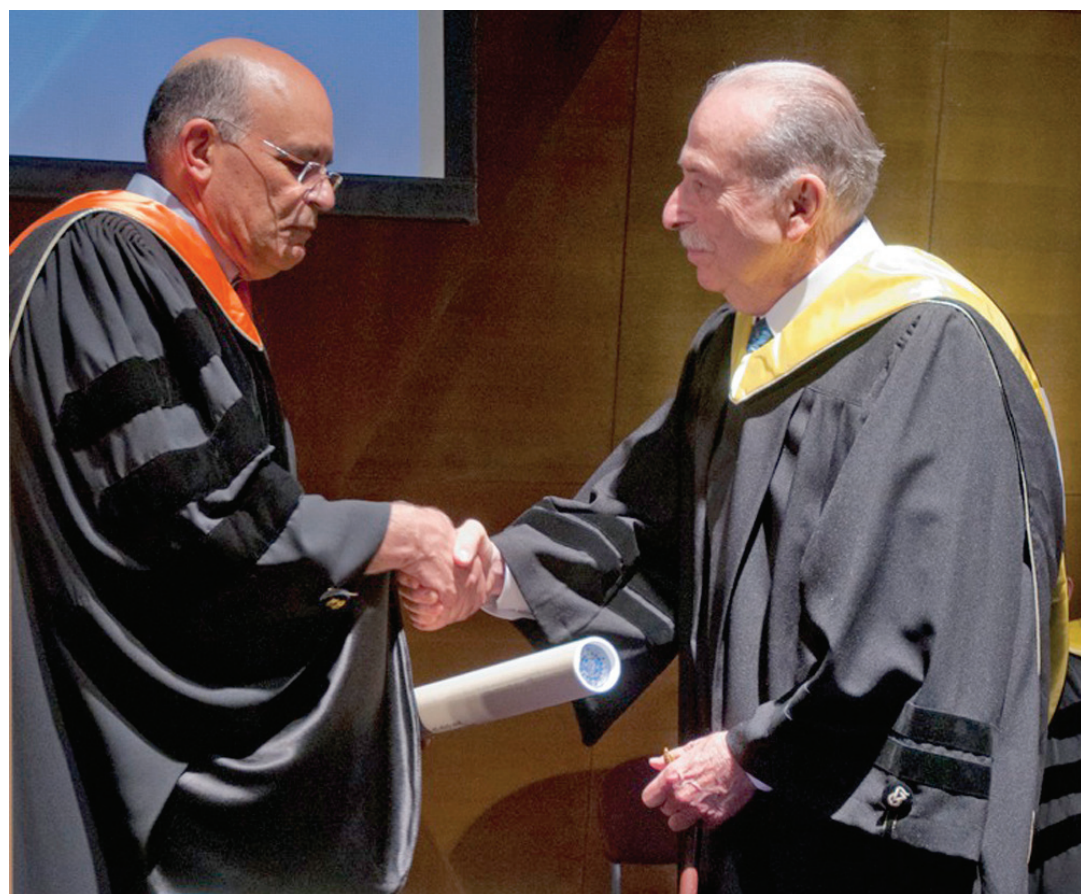

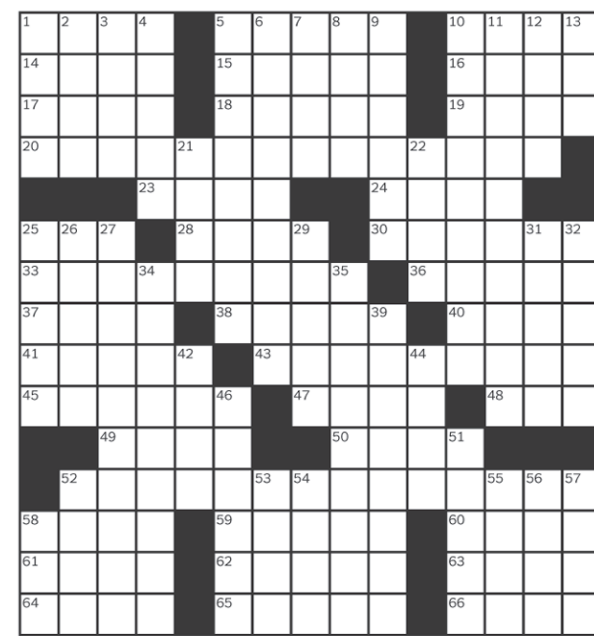
