Tt's hard to believe that it's been five years since the death of ▲actress and advocate Farrah Fawcett.

The Farrah Fawcett Foundation (FFF) honored the passing with a reception of friends, family and FFF supporters at the Foundation's Beverly Hills headquarters. Among those paying tribute were longtime love and Malibu local Ryan O'Neal and Farrah's "Charlie's Angels" co-star, Jaclyn Smith. FFF President Alana Stewart welcomed guests and discussed the Foundation's partnership with Stand Up 2 Cancer and the translational research team established to help find a cure for HPV-related cancers. The mission of the FFF is to provide funding for cutting-edge cancer research, to support prevention and awareness, and to help those struggling with cancer. Farrah Fawcett was diagnosed with anal cancer in 2006. She established the Foundation before her death in 2009.
