For students enrolled in SMMUSD:

A meal service has been set up by the school district for all students enrolled in its schools or programs. The free breakfast and lunch, served as "grab-and-go bagged meals," are available for pick up at Webster Elementary, Samohi, McKinley and Will Rogers from 7-9 a.m. A parent/guardian is required to accompany any student not in high school.

Hours of operation/closures:

- LA County Animal Care Centers—closed to the public

 MUSE School, Pepperdine University classes transitioned to remote
 learning

Statewide/countywide mandates:

- Restaurants—carryout or delivery only; gyms, bars, theaters, entertainment venues—closed
- CA residents must "heed any orders and guidance of state and local public health officials"
- One-week waiting period waived for disability insurance applicants who are unemployed and disabled due to the virus
- One-week waiting period waived for applicants applying for unemployment insurance due to the virus
- 60-day grace period for individuals/businesses unable to file a tax return due to complying with a recommendation for social distancing related to the virus, as well as an extension for filing, payment, audits, billing, notices, claims for refunds and more under similar circumstances
- The state ability to "commandeer property—hotels and other facilities that are suitable for use as places of temporary residence or medical facilities" for patients who test positive for the virus, or who have had exposure to it
- Public officials will be allowed to hold public meetings via teleconferencing, and make the meetings available to the public electronically
- Provisions for workers in California affected by COVID-19. Those unable to work due to caring for an ill/quarantined family member may qualify for paid family leave.
- Residents may not be evicted due late/missed rent payments caused by a recent layoff or decline in work hours
- Ban on gatherings of more than 250 people in the same area
